Focusing on new variant CJD

These images represent the pathological changes seen in the cerebral cortex of a person who died of new variant Creutzfeldt-Jakob disease. In the top image, hematoxylin-eosin staining reveals distinct "florid plaques" (arrows), characterized by a central eosinophilic core with a feathery peripheral ring surrounded by a halo of spongiform change. Spongiform change is also apparent in the surrounding neuropil (arrowheads). In the image below, immunoperoxidase staining reveals extensive deposition of proteaseresistant prion protein, both in the florid plaques (arrows) and as small punctate deposits (arrowheads).
