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# They should be ashamed

The spectacle of right-wing Americans doing battle with the editor of a medical journal editor is disheartening to those who espouse editorial independence.<sup>1</sup> My concern is with a right-wing body, the American Medical

Association, and its summary dismissal of Dr. George Lundberg, the respected and long-serving editor of *JAMA*.

During his 17 years with that journal, Lundberg helped it become a first-rank scientific publication. He rigorously adhered to a policy of editorial independence,<sup>2</sup> a principle endorsed on several occasions by the AMA Board of Trustees.<sup>3,4</sup> Yet the publication of an unsolicited, peer-reviewed paper,<sup>5</sup> tangentially relevant to the Clinton affair, was sufficient cause for the AMA's conservative ideologues to dismiss this accomplished editor. They should be ashamed.
