Crook, Alfred Frazer, Carleton Place, Ont.; Queen's University, Belfast, Ireland, 1939, radiation oncology. Died Apr. 28, 2006, aged 89. "Loving husband of Alice. Dear father of Ann (Michael Berry), John (Janey), Brian and Tim, and stepfather of Drew Allen (Sue). Cherished grandfather of Frazer and Edward Berry, Gerry and Michael Crook, and Hadden and Derek Allen. He was predeceased by his first wife, Audrey White. Captain Crook served his country with pride during World War II as a member of the Royal Medical Army Corp. He served in North Africa (Alemein) and Italy, where he was wounded. From 1959 to 1981 he was Head of the Cancer Clinic at the old General Hospital and of the new Clinic, which he helped design and establish at the present Smyth Rd Campus."

He joined the staff of the Ottawa General Hospital in 1965, where for many years he was the solo neuroradiologist, recognized for his excellent technical skills and impeccable safety record in dealing with unstable neurological patients.
