Bohlig, Gustav K., Ottawa; Munich University (Germany), 1948; former staff, Ottawa Civic, Grace and St. Vincent hospitals. Died Sept. 16, 2002, aged 83; survived by his wife, Maria.

Cumming, John H., Vancouver; University of Toronto, 1949; psychiatry; CRCPC; former honorary staff, Health Science Centre and Vancouver General Hospital; consultant, Royal Jubilee Hospital and British Columbia Department of Health; clinical professor, University of British Columbia. Died Oct. 10, 2002, aged 85, following a stroke; survived by his wife, Elaine, and 2 sons.

Dorman, J. Garth, North Vancouver; University of British Columbia, 1961; former staff, Lions Gate Hospital. Died Oct. 17, 2002, aged 66.

Ewert, Robert A., Fort St. John, BC; McGill University, 1953; general surgery; FRCSC, CRCSC; former staff, Prince George Regional Hospital. Died Oct. 4, 2002, aged 74.

Gayman, George R., University of Toronto, 1941; RCNVR, WW II; former staff, Children's Hospital, Vancouver. Died Nov. 1, 2002, aged 87; survived by 3 children. Dr. Roy Forsey recalls: "He served in the same destroyer escort group as Prince Philip and represented the Royal Canadian Navy when General MacArthur received the surrender of the Japanese."

Harrison, R. Cameron, Vancouver; University of Alberta, 1943; general surgery; DABS, FACS, FRCSC; former head, Department of Surgery, Vancouver General Hospital; professor emeritus

and head, Department of Surgery, University of British Columbia; founding member, Canadian Association of General Surgeons; president, International Surgical Group and Canadian Association of Gastroenterology. Died Oct. 25, 2002, aged 82; survived by his wife, Lorraine, and 5 sons. His son, Dr. Robert Harrison, commented: "He discovered a gastric acid inhibitory hormone in the antrum of the stomach — his 'antral chalone' — which in retrospect could be somatostatin. He did not receive credit for its discovery but he demonstrated, in the 1950s, a totally different concept of gastric acid secretion controls and balances. In his private life, he led his family into many adventures, and they led him into a few as well."

Hasinoff, David, Toronto; University of Manitoba, 1935; MCFP; former chief of staff, Vermilion Hospital; board member, Vegreville Auxiliary Hospital; longest serving coroner in Alberta. Died Oct. 17, 2002, aged 89. His daughter, Dr. Jacqueline Jirsch, observed: " 'Doc Hasinoff' practised in remote rural communities in Saskatchewan and north-eastern Alberta from 1938 until 1994, and by default he served as ambulance driver, undertaker, veterinarian, dentist, educator and mayor."
