Cooper, Gardner E., Hamilton, Ont.; University of Toronto, 1940; general and orthopedic surgery; Captain, Royal Canadian Army Medical Corps; chief of surgery, Hamilton Civic Hospitals (1959–81). Died Aug. 1, 2005, aged 90; survived by his children, Arthur, David and Elizabeth and 3 grandchildren.

Follett, Arthur V., Calgary; University of Alberta, 1948. Died May 26, 2005, aged 81.

Died after a brief
