## **Patients Cognitive Interview Guide**

This interview will be about your experience completing the Health Equity Survey, the survey that you just completed. To get started, I will ask you to answer a one page Post Survey Questionnaire, so that we can get a general idea of your experience with the Health Equity survey. In the questionnaire you will be asked about each of the questions in the Health Equity Survey and whether you found it difficult and/or uncomfortable to answer. Even if it made you feel just a little bit uncomfortable or you found it just a little bit difficult, please indicate so by checking off the appropriate boxes. If you didn't think a question was difficult or made you feel uncomfortable at all, you do not need to check anything off. Please ask me any questions you may have while completing it.

After that, we will talk about your experience with each one of the questions included in the Health Equity Survey. The questionnaire and interview should take around 25 minutes to complete. The interview will be audio-recorded. When you have completed the questionnaire, I will start the audio recorder.

[Give questionnaire to participant]

[Start audio recorder and say participant ID and date] During the interview, please try to not mention anyone by name. If it does occur, we will remove their name when we transcribe this interview from the recording. You can skip any question you wish and may also stop the interview at any time.

We are most interested in how you decided to answer questions and any problems you may have had. Therefore, any details on the way you understood a question or the logic you used to answer the question are important, even if it seems irrelevant or unimportant. I didn't write the Health Equity Survey questions so don't worry about hurting my feelings if you criticize them — my job is to find out how they can be improved.
