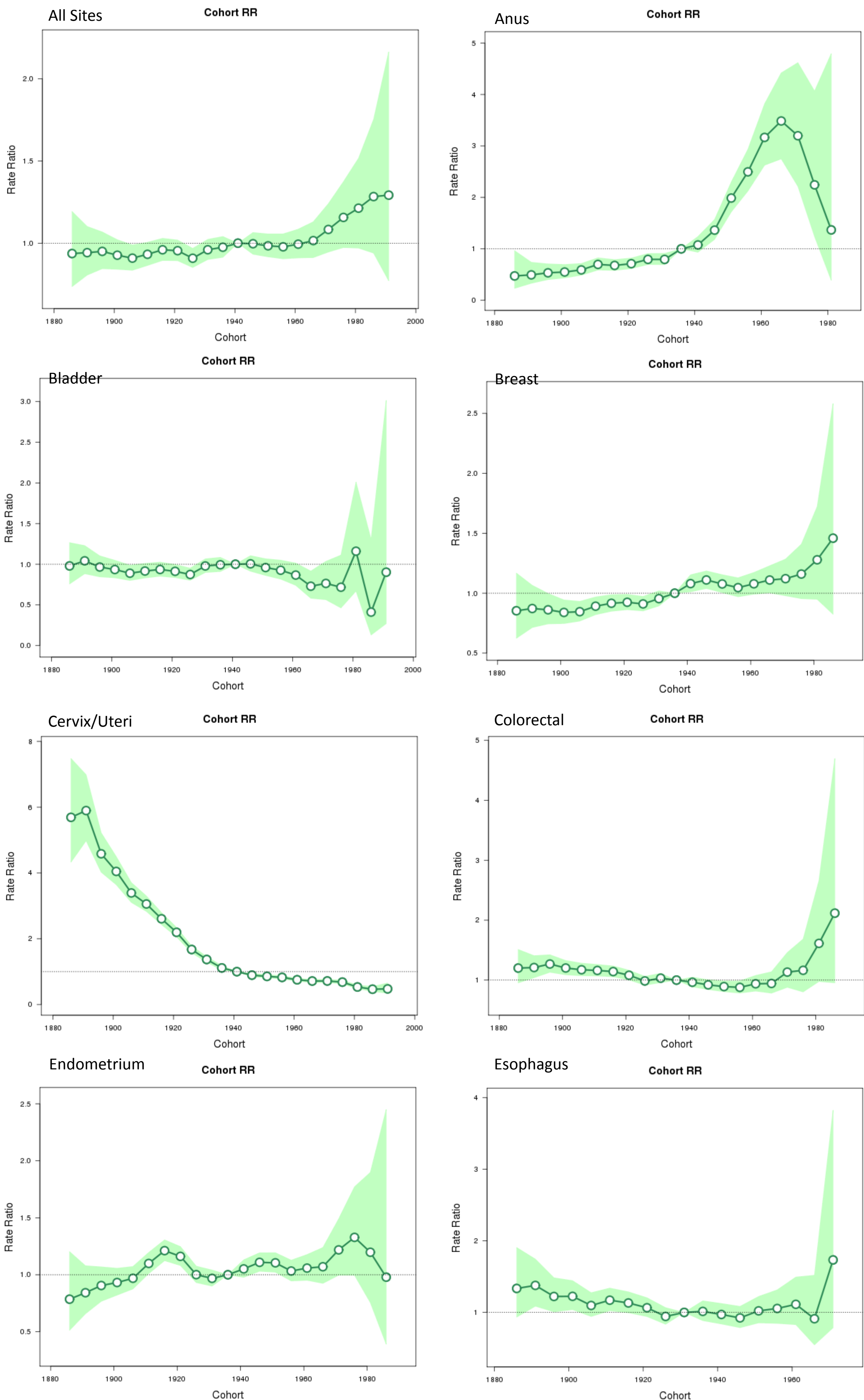


Figure 1. Cancer incidence rate ratios (95% confidence intervals represented by shaded area) by five-year cohort in females relative to the 1941-1945 reference category.

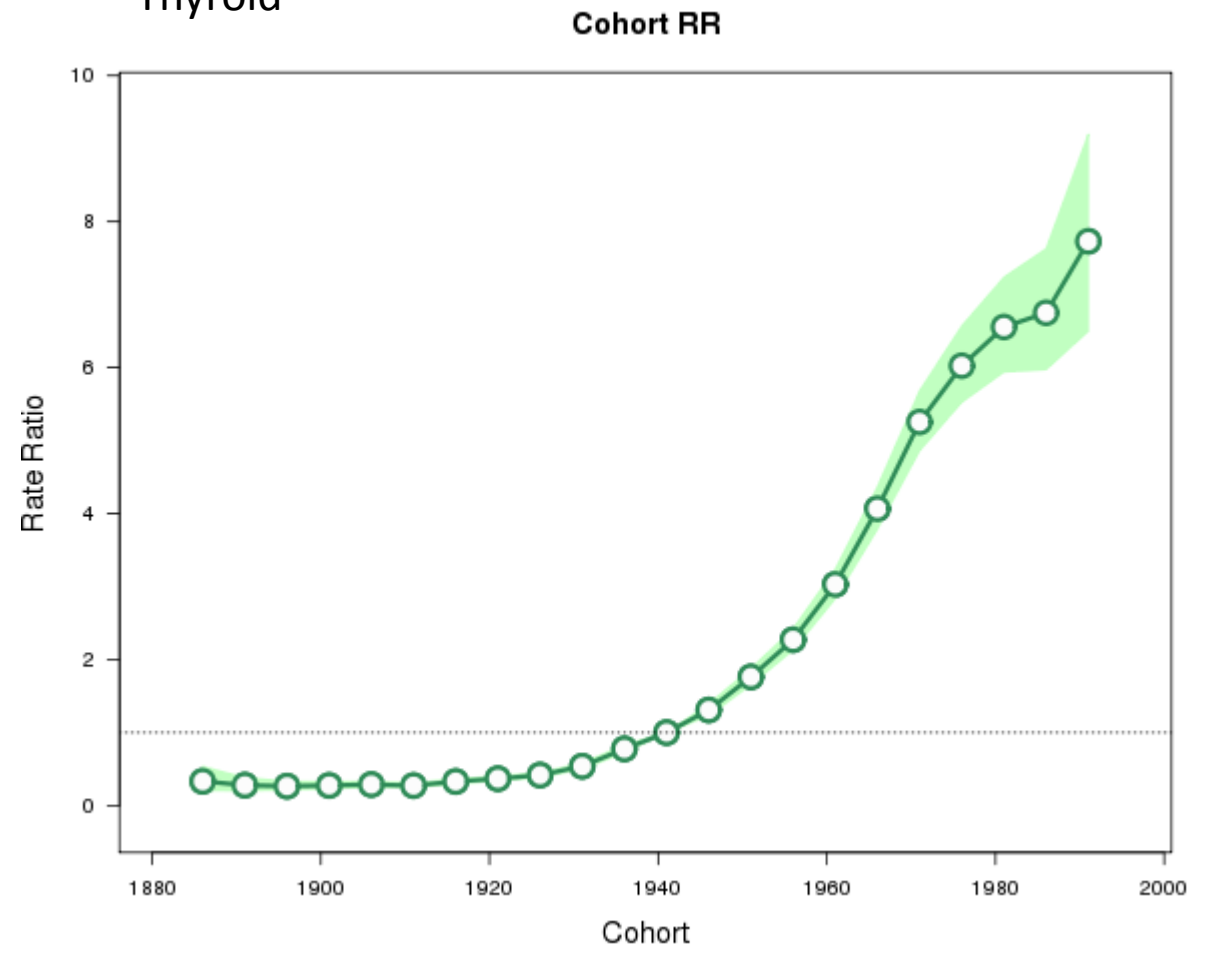
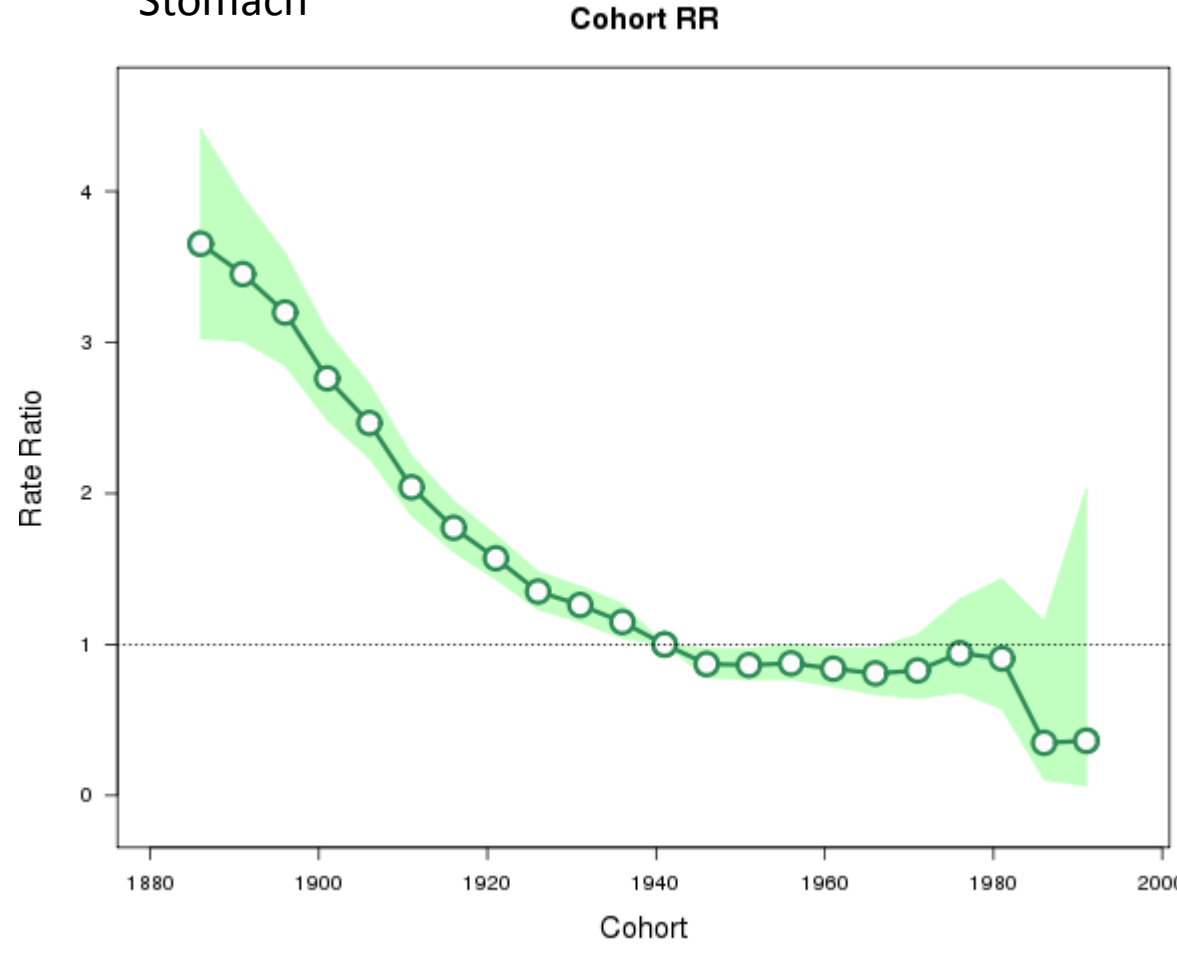
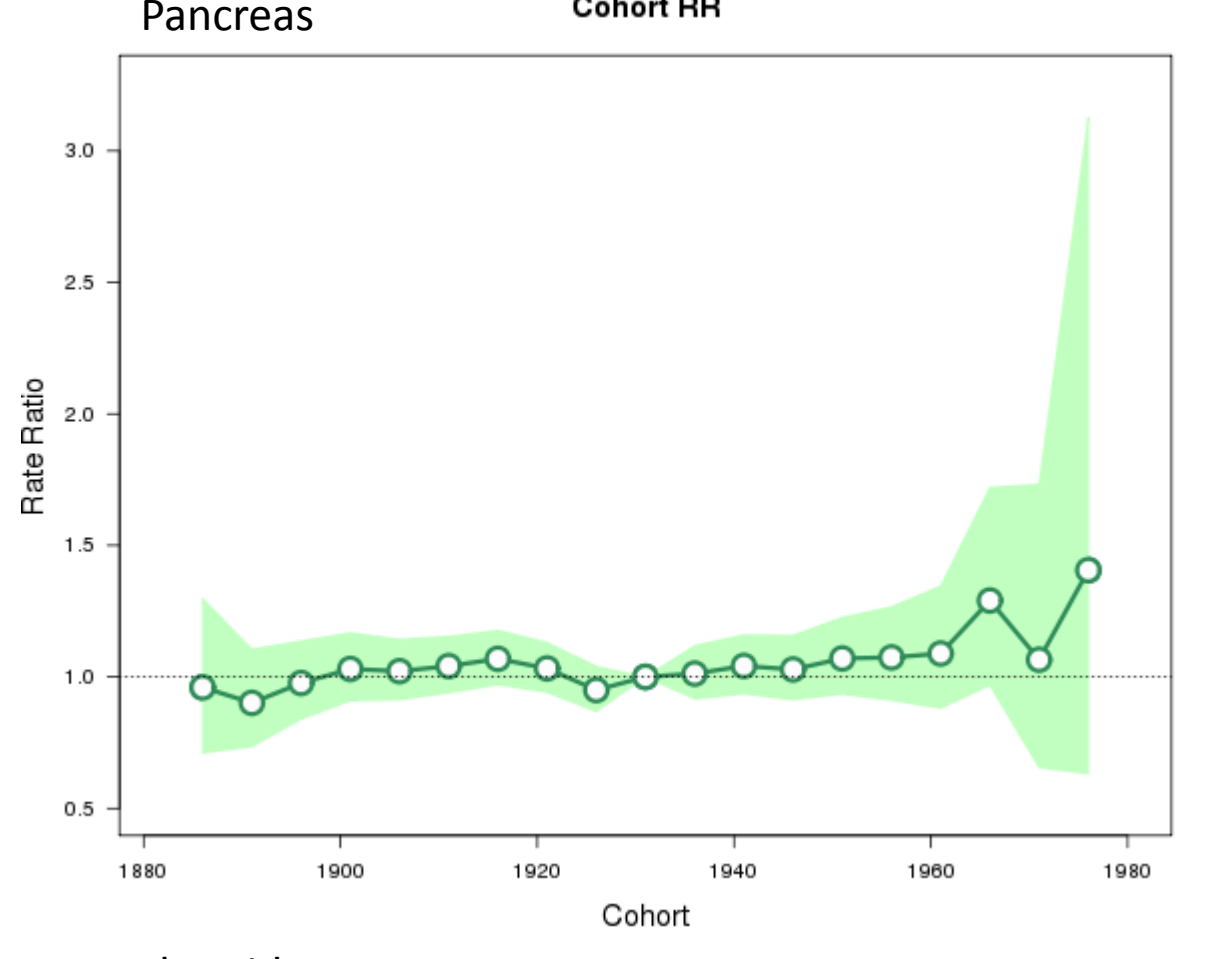
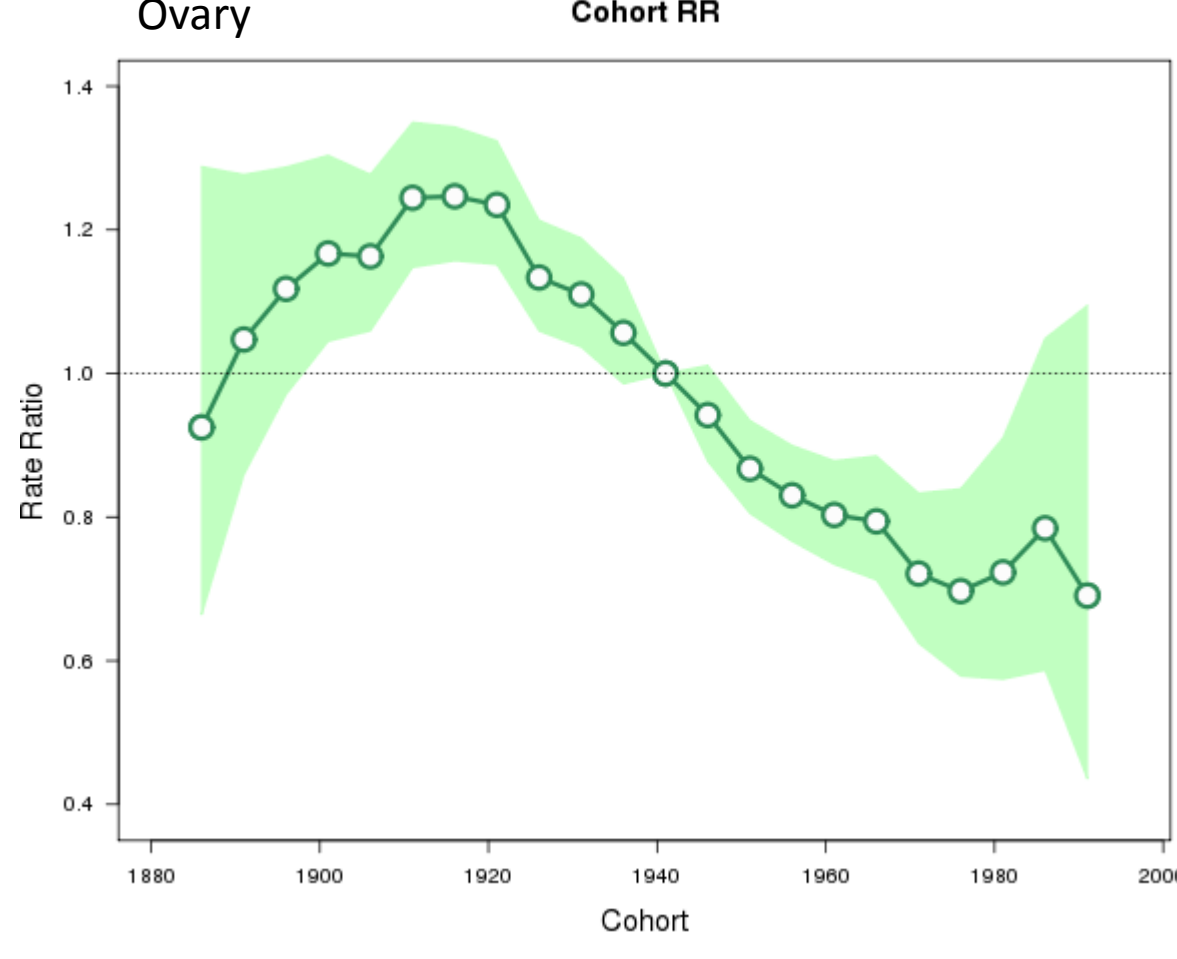
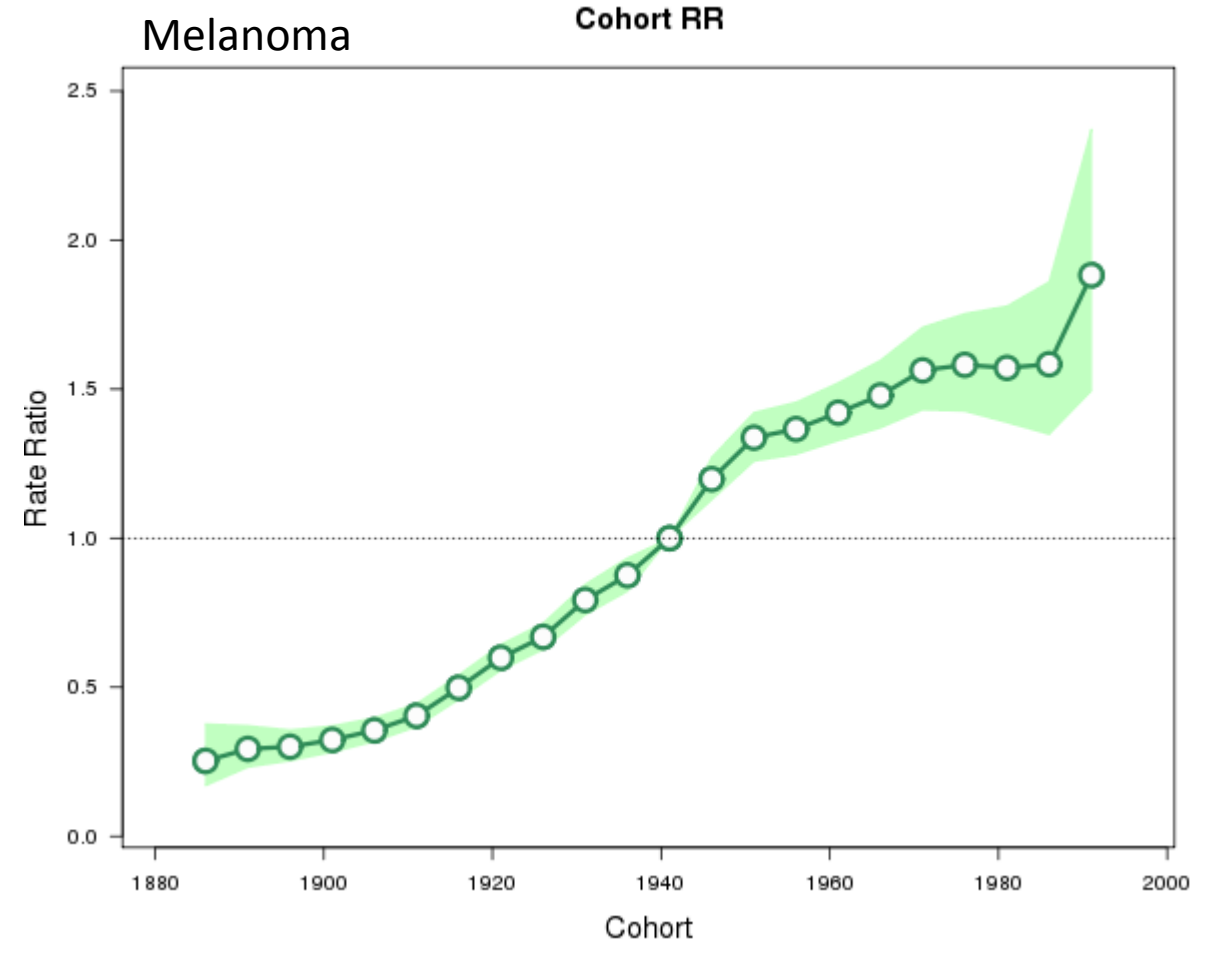
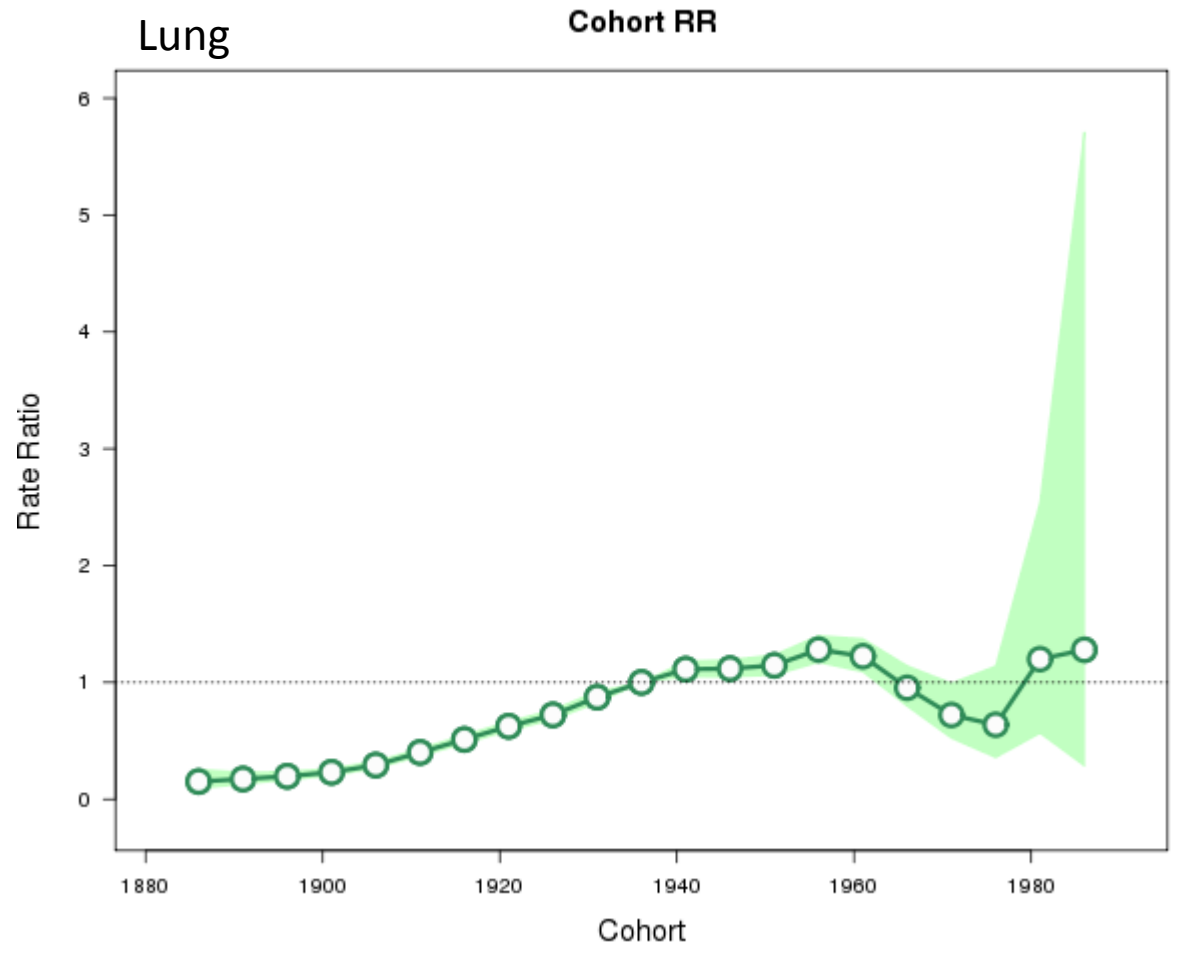
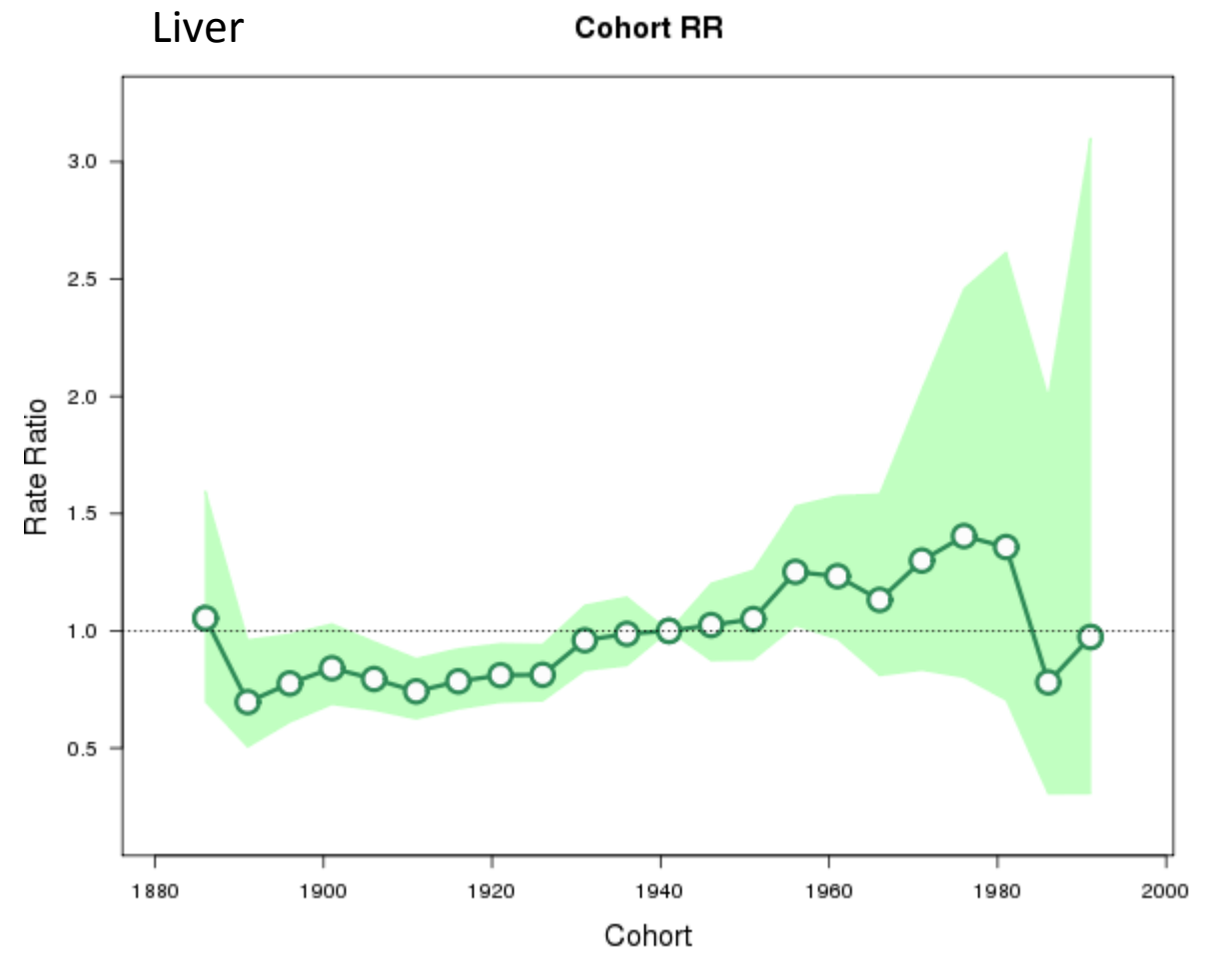
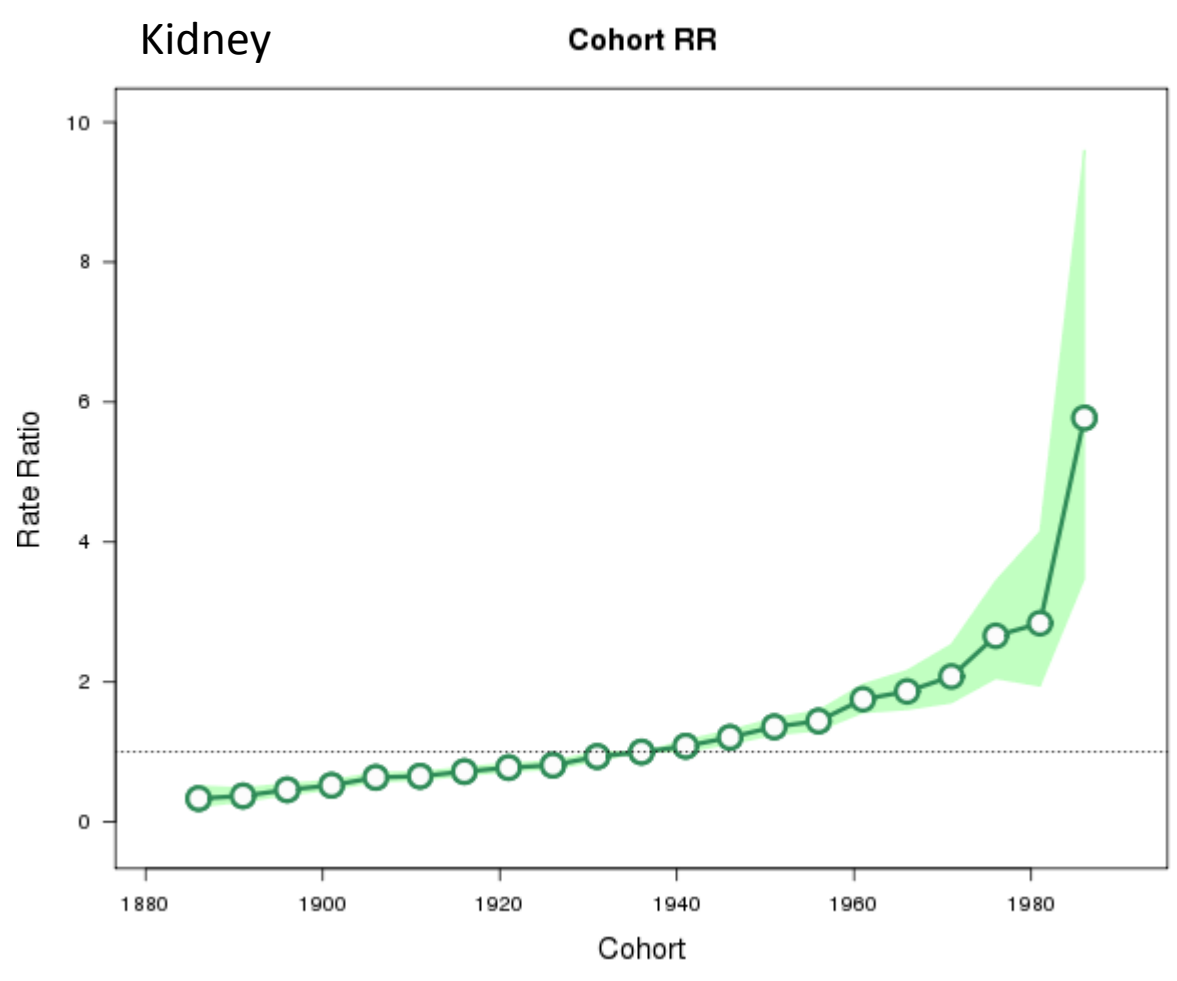

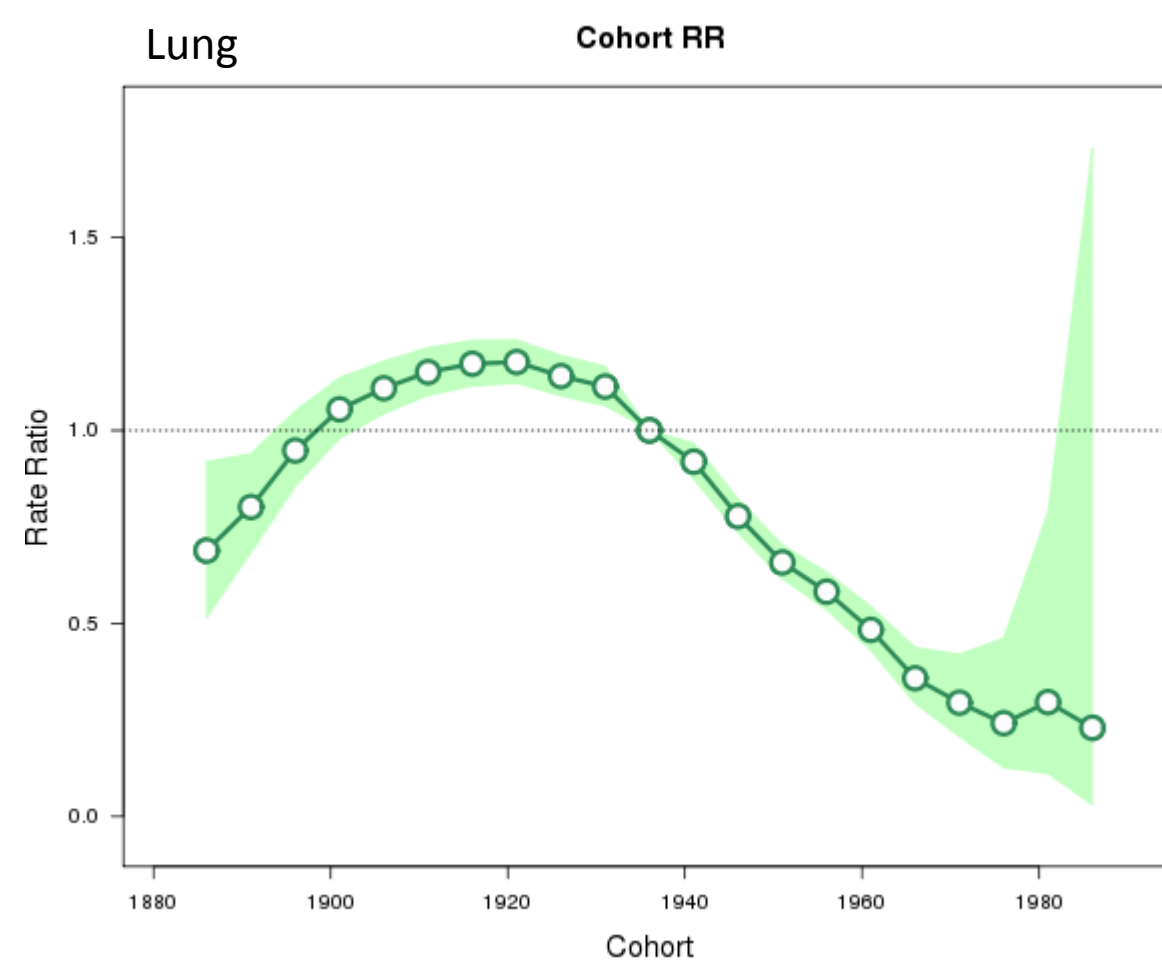
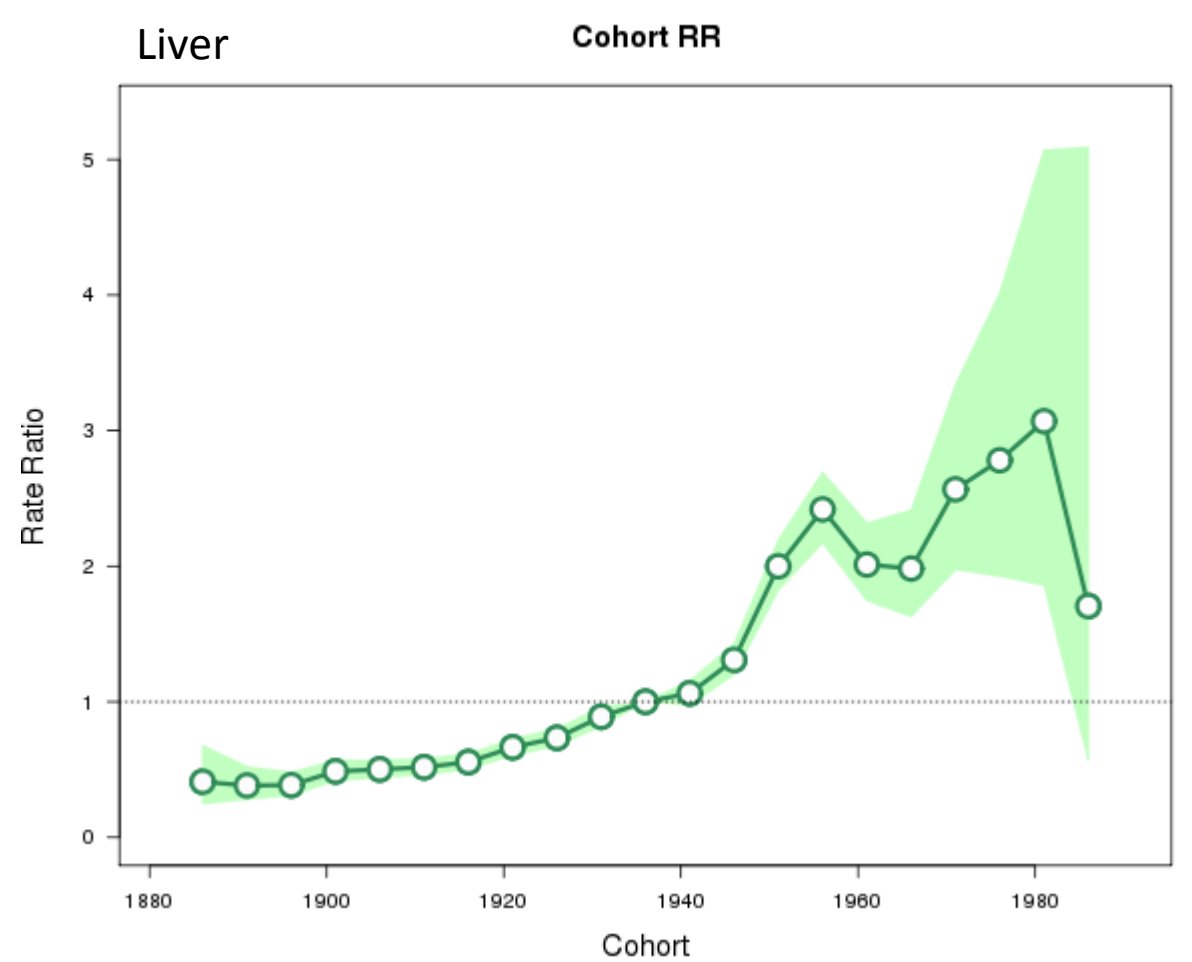
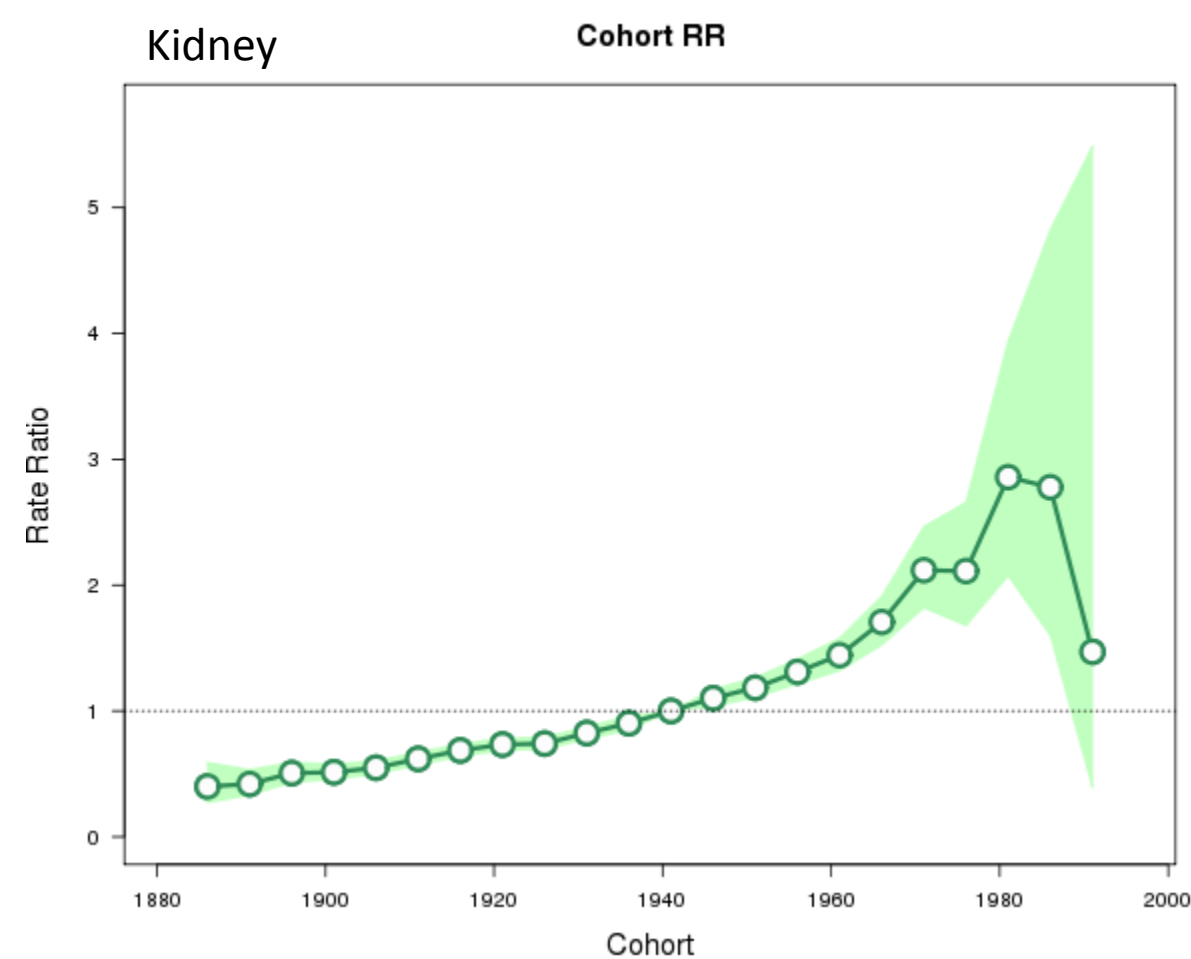
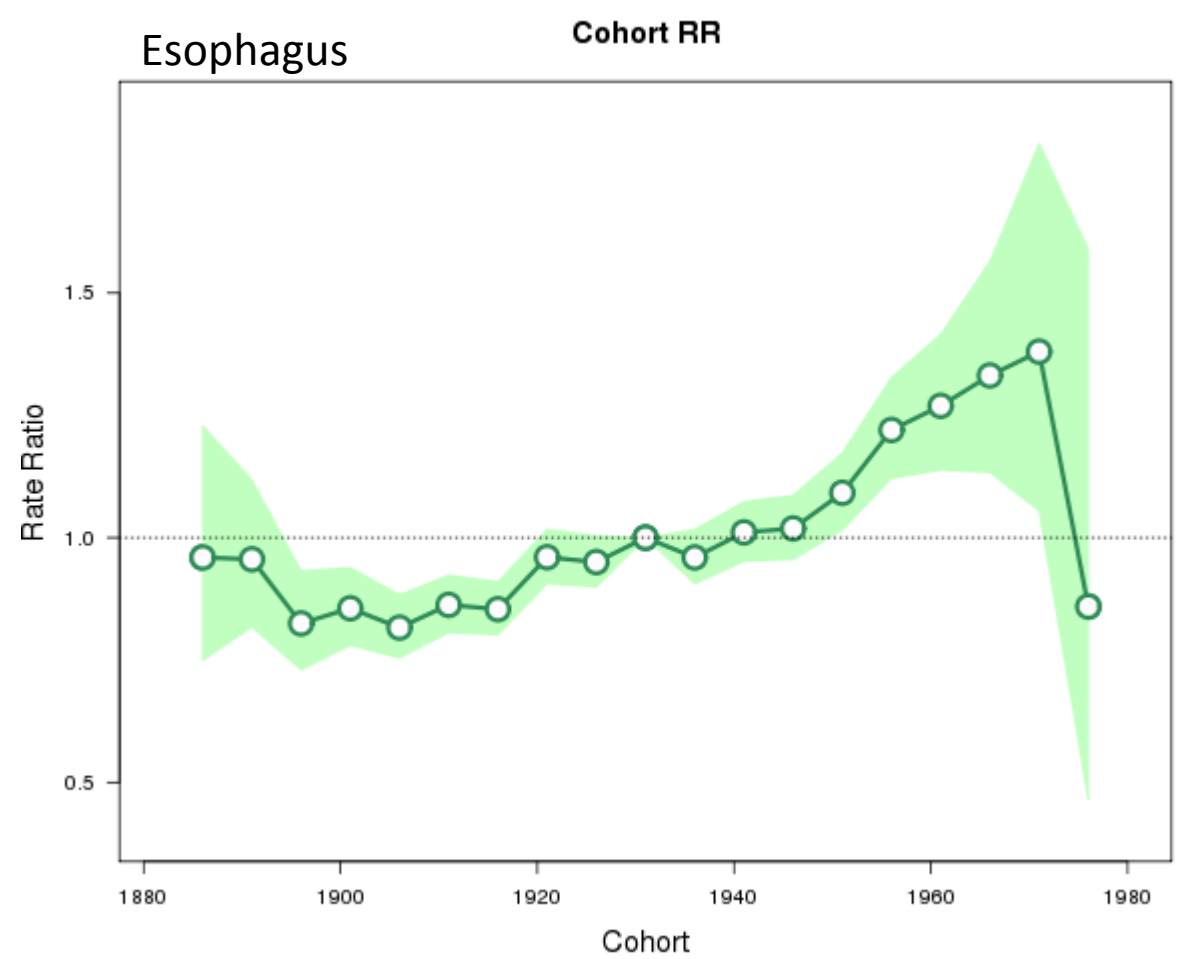
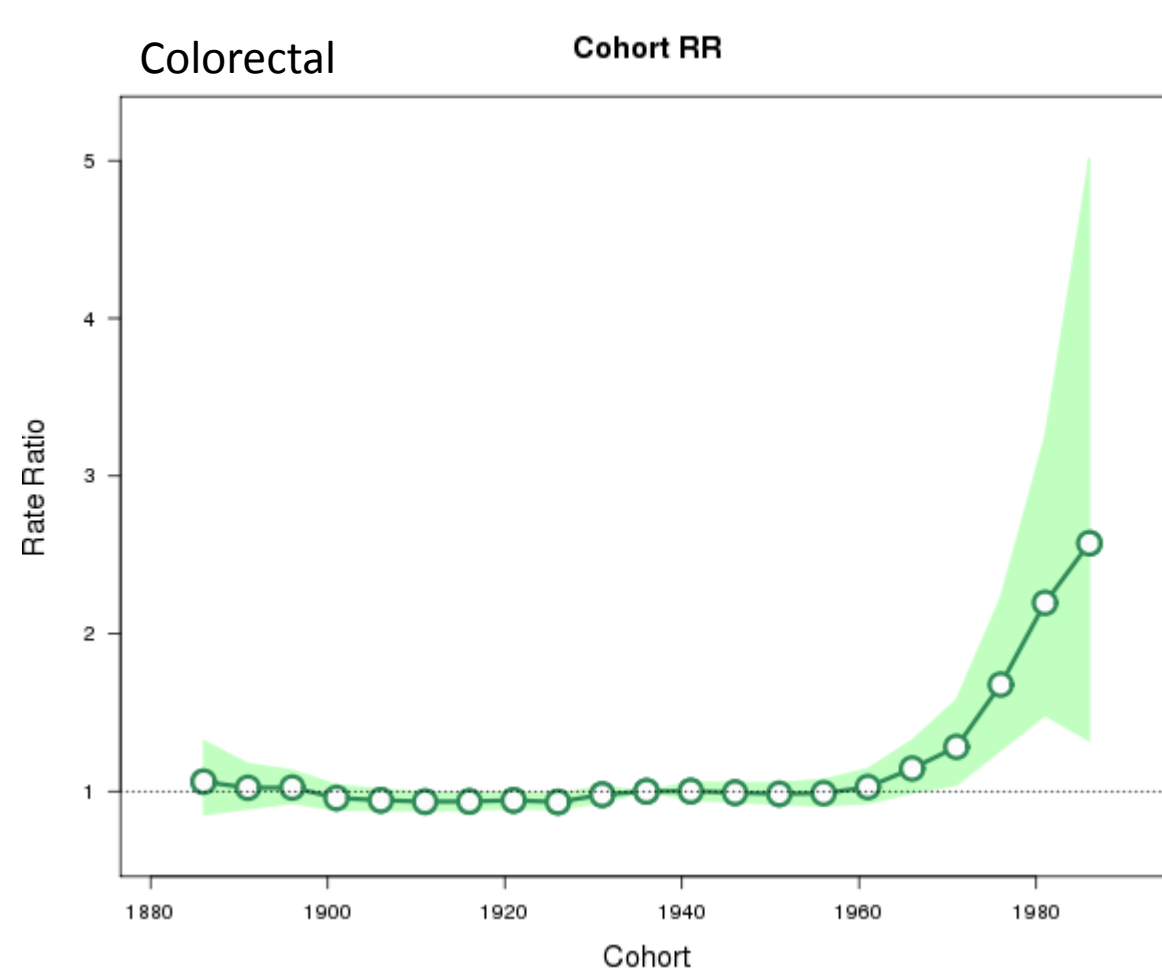
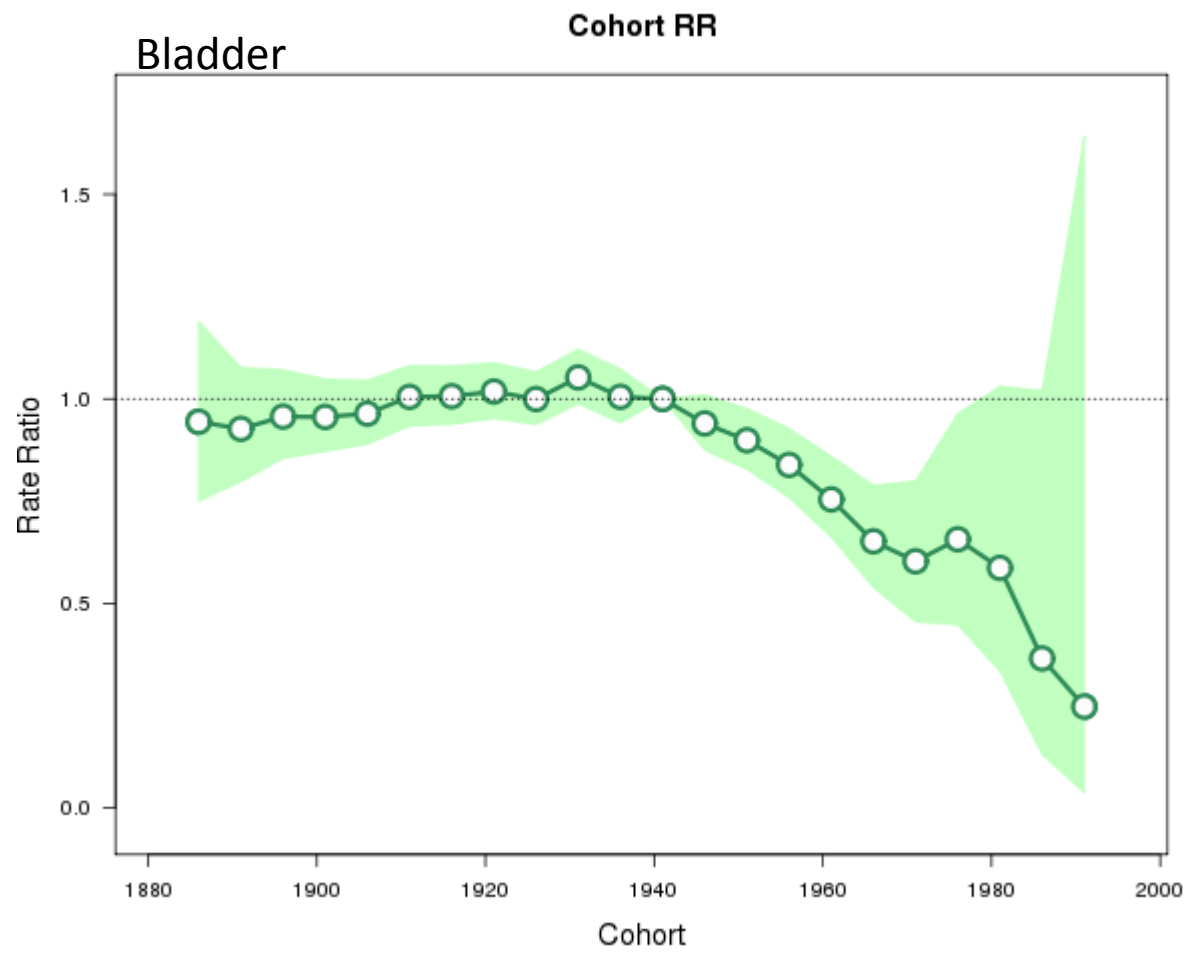
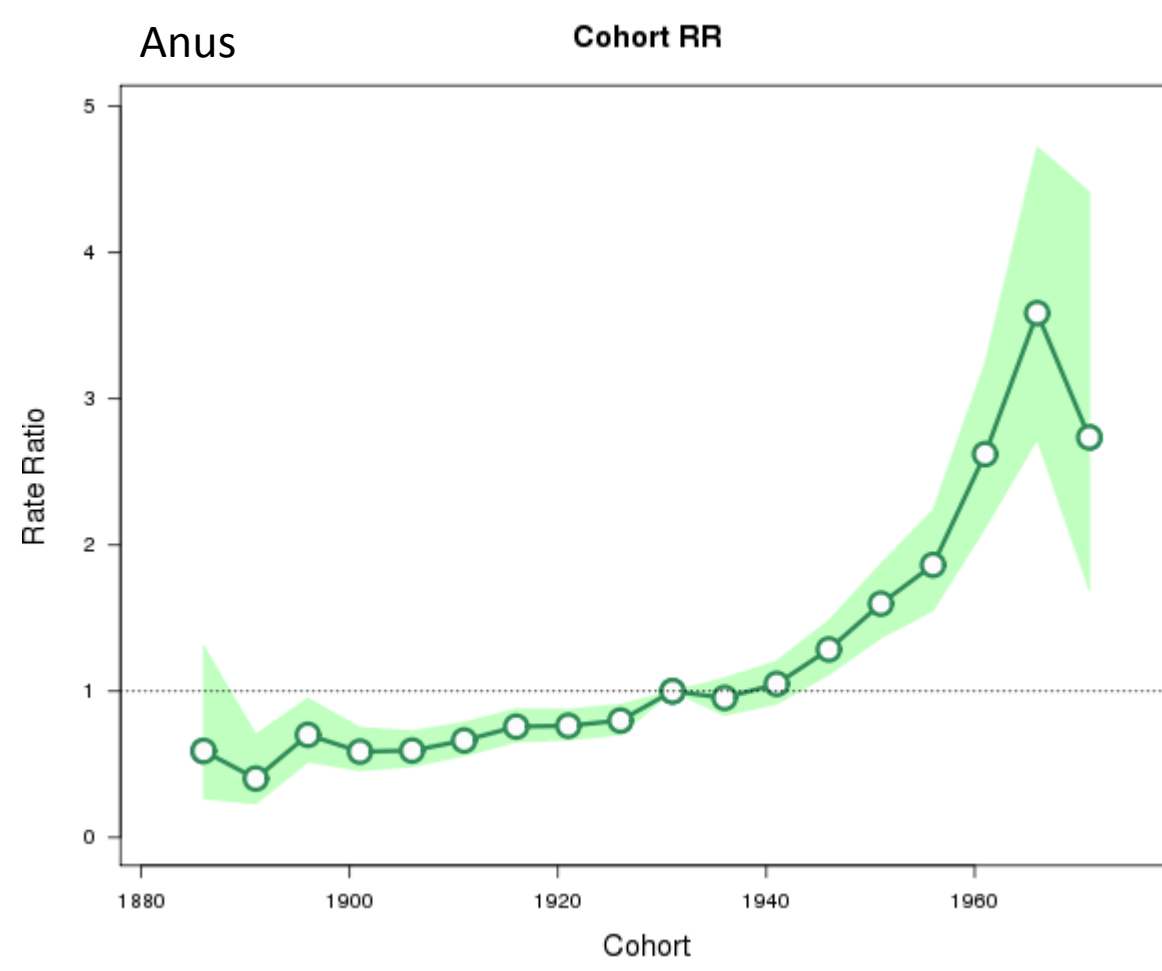
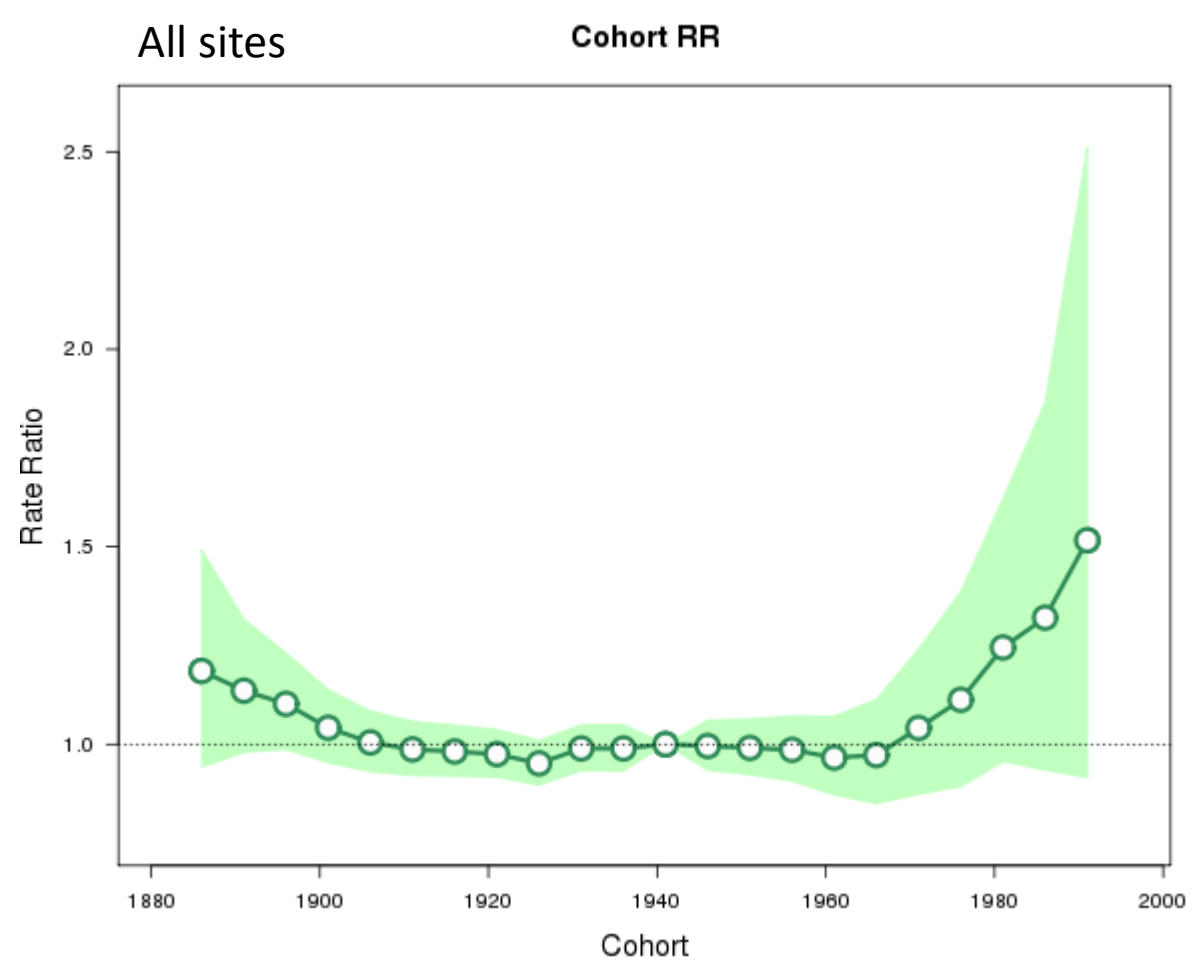


Figure 2. Cancer incidence rate ratios (95% confidence intervals represented by shaded area) by five-year cohort in males relative to the 1941-1945 reference category.

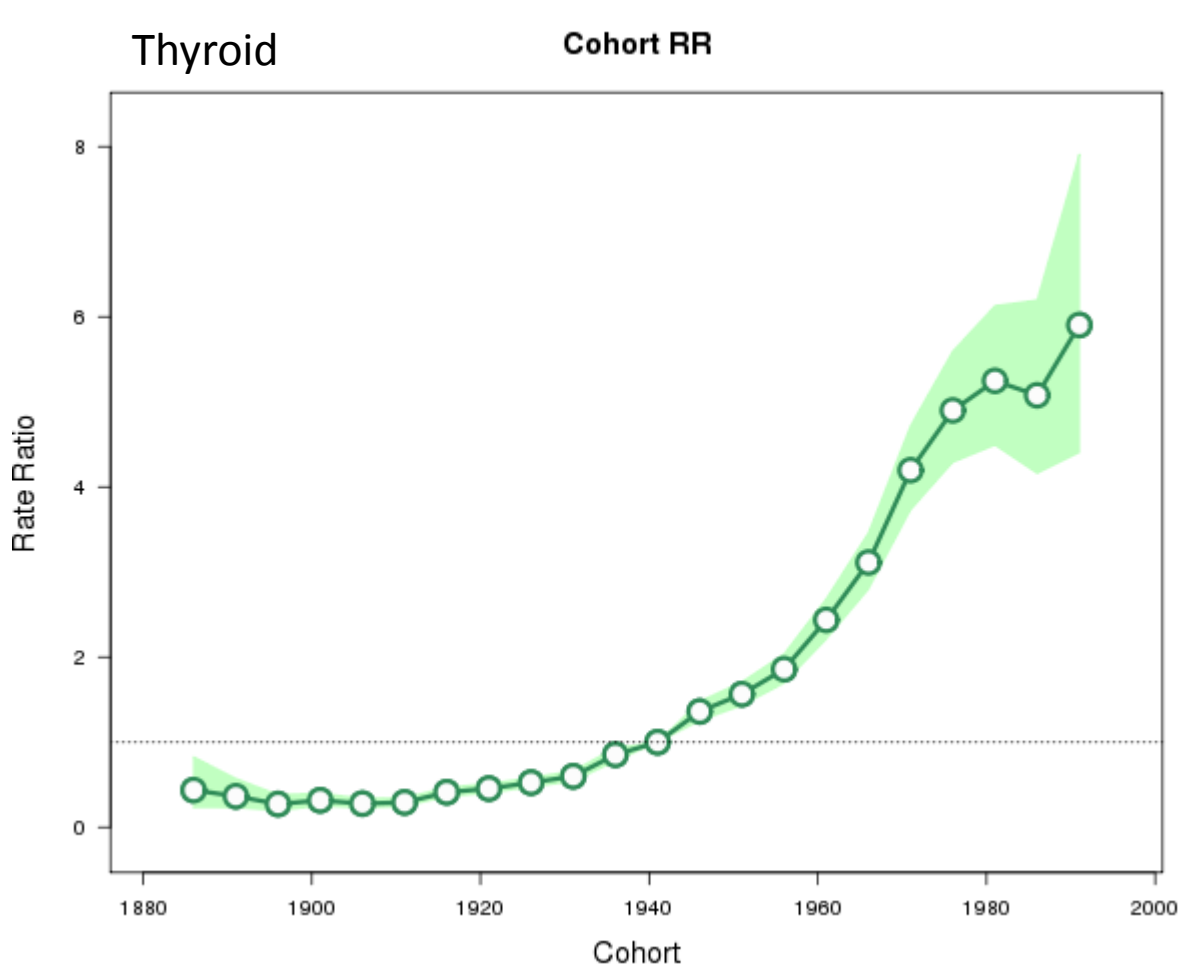
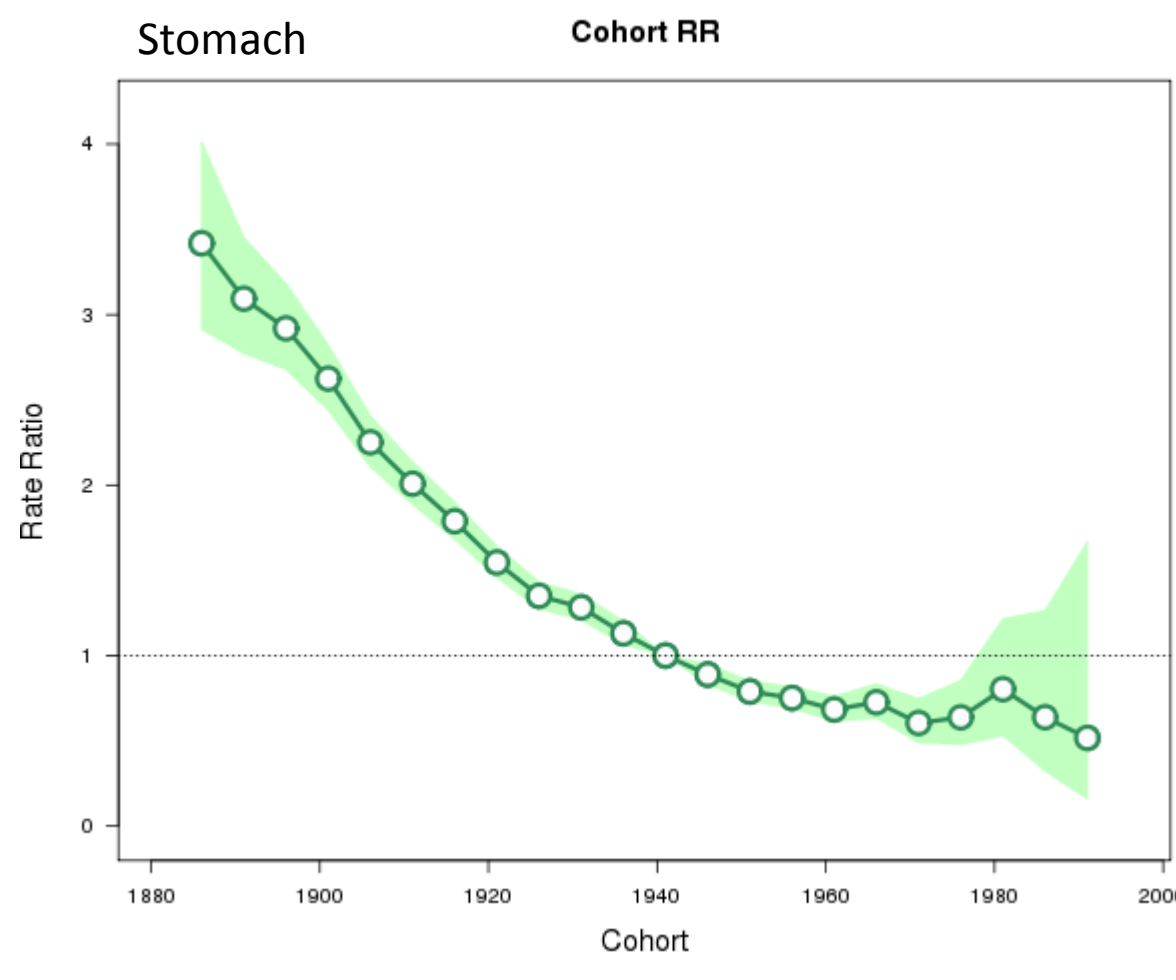
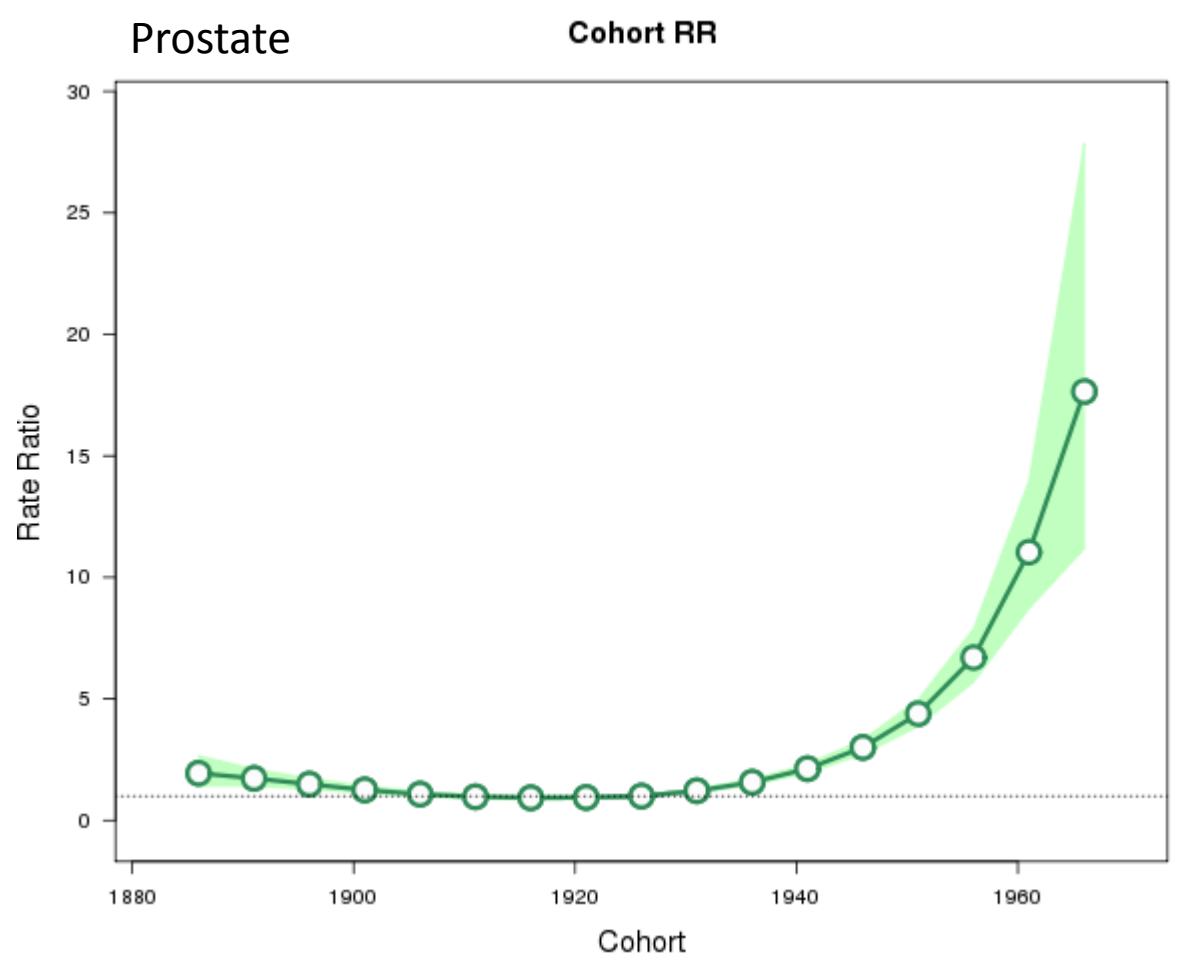
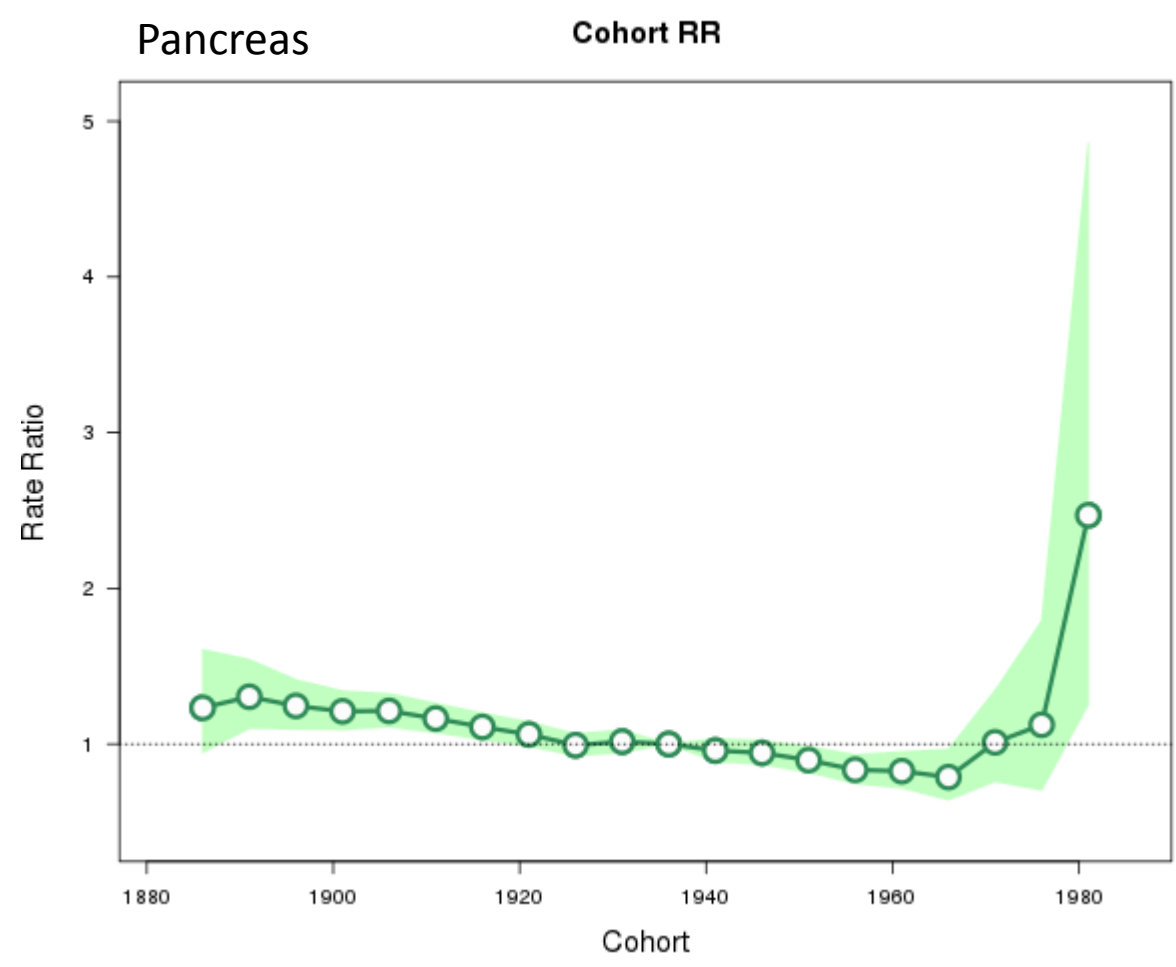
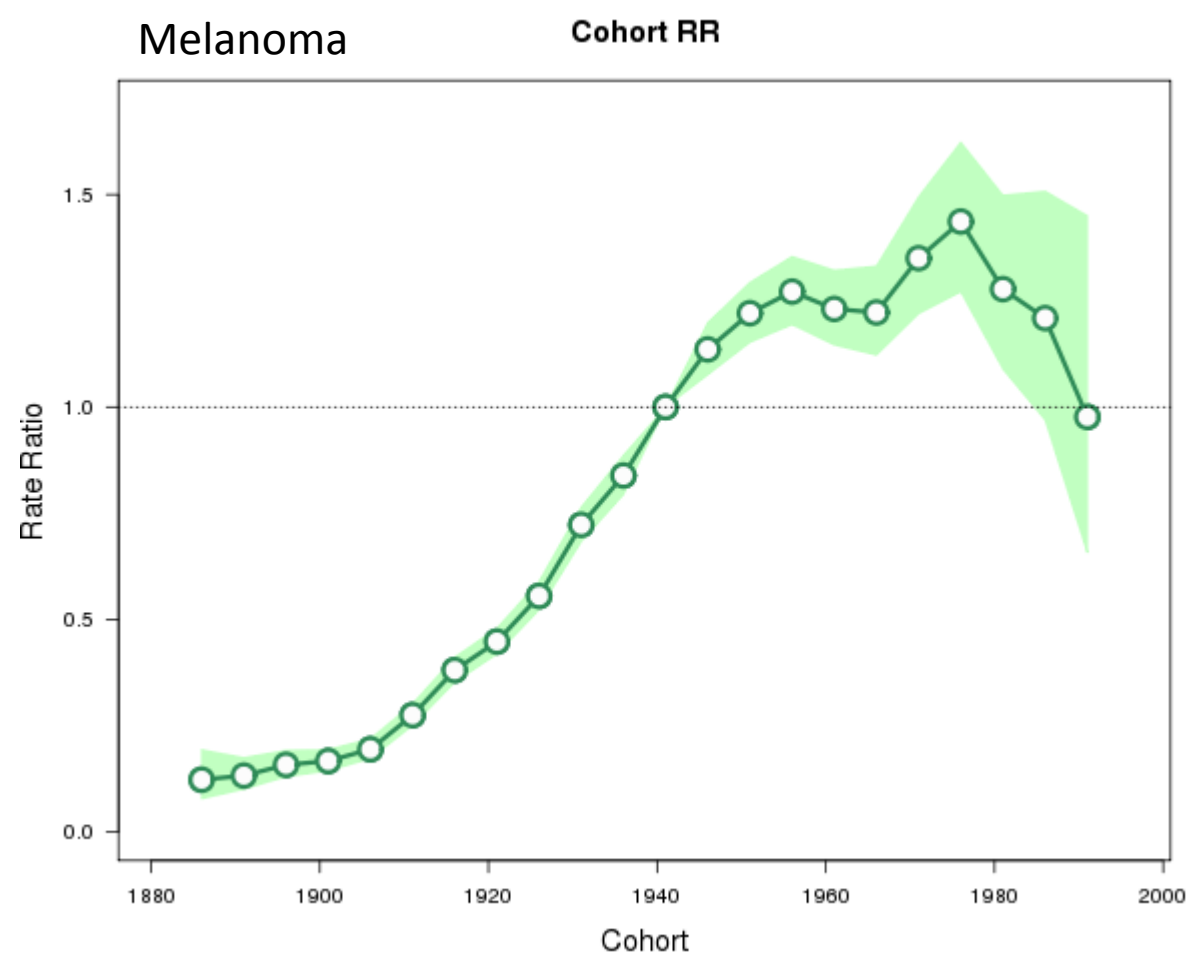
